Literacy is:

- Listening and Talking
- Reading
- Writing

Listening and Talking is central to all learning.

- Continue to talk about rhyming words by playing games and singing songs e.g. Humpty Dumpty
- Find things which begin with the sound *a*, *b*, *c* etc.
- Encourage your child to use words like and, or, then, because etc. to help to develop their speech. e.g.
 "What did you do at school today"?
 "I did my writing, then I went out to play."
- Give your child increasingly more complex instructions e.g. "Put the book and the toy on the top shelf in the cupboard and then close the door."
- Help your child to discuss feelings by using HOW and WHY questions.

e.g. "How do you feel"? (excited, disappointed, happy, worried, anxious) "Why do you feel like that?"

Reading for Information and Enjoyment

- Continue to visit the Library and read to your child every day.
- When you read with your child you could ask "What do think will happen next?" "What is your favourite part of the story?"
- Encourage them to find words they already recognise in books, environment, newspapers, food packets etc.
- Look for common words like: *the, of, and, a, to* etc.



Take them to a Library and enjoy choosing both fiction and non fiction books.

Ask your child to read signs in the environment which give information e.g POLICE, ENTRANCE, EXIT, shop signs, adverts etc.



Sharing a book with your child for 10 minutes every day will develop his/her desire to read.

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
